Roger Debell:

Good Morning, welcome and thank you to everyone for attending. Now that we are into the middle of October we are getting comfortable with the routine and consistency of the school day. His big hope is that everyone is happy to be back and school and he is so appreciative of being able to see parents and kids at pick up/drop off. Roger is hopeful that we will remain active and open.

There is a case that has just been reported at Mendon High School at this time the school has not received any notification that our school will be affected in any way as the result of that at this time.

Teachers & staff are getting contingency plans in place when/if we need to switch over to remote learning. Hopefully we will not need to use that. We are one of the few districts that have been able to offer in-person opportunities for our students.

Treasurer Report: Liz & Teague Ruder

Some of our traditional fundraisers are unable to happen this year so we needed to take a good look at the budget for this year.

Budget was shared.

There are a lot of unknowns in the budget right now. If you have not paid your membership dues please due that. The school receives an allotment of \$4.75/student and we have 415 students at TRE.

We will be able to do a Scholastic Book Fair but it has to be online. In the past we have received cash revenue into our budget from this. This year we will only be able to receive Scholastic Dollars.

Also, Box Tops have been transitioned almost exclusively to online/app we haven't seen too much of a dip in these dollars so please keep submitting these.

Can Kings have been one of the bigger revenue drivers and will continue to be operational this year. If you have cans and need Liz to bring them in for you let her know.

Reindeer Lane (holiday shop) was a bigger fundraiser and can't/won't happen this year.

There is a line that is in the budget that says "Winter Festival/Sock Hop" is a line in the budget that we utilize to track the Basket Bonaza. We don't know if this will be able to happen this year and it may need to be replaced w/ online option.

Gifts to School - This year suggested Ipads (12) for kindergarten classes. There may be regulations that would make this not allowable expense. Roger also suggested that if it is allowable that maybe we could do 50/50 with the school. The cost would be all inclusive-device, case, software, etc. *items purchased can't be for "instructional" and the expense needs to be purchased for all students.

Past Years we have purchased stage curtains, mats for gym was one item that we were going to donate to however Mr. Debell was able to secure funding from another source. Chrome books were purchased for After School Enrichment in the past.

Question in chat:

I think Andrea has a great point in letting people know where the PTSA money goes. I believe it would increase membership and is of interest to the community to know what is being funded. I know there is some information on the PCSD site but I think making a graphic organizer or a short video and sharing it on social media would be helpful.

Question in chat: What is the difference between teacher appreciation and new family hospitality. It was clarified that in the past there have been new-family meetings and the PTSA has provided snacks for these meetings which is what that new family hospitality line is used for.

Today was the presentation of the budget, there may changes that need to be made to it. At the November meeting anyone w/ paid membership to the PTSA will be able to vote to approve the budget.

In chat:

Rachel Nichols says that there was money from Science Action last year that was not used. Teague advised that we may be able to pull that forward.

International Day Passports are not currently in the budget but parents said that kids really enjoy those. The cost of these books is pretty high as they are currently being done but we can revisit options for this once we get closer to the event.

Roger DeBell:

There is a lot of interest in generating activities to raise positive feelings around school. Student Council is not currently up and running. Discussed the possibility of doing a monthly school spirit days.

School Spirit Days: In addition to school pride Friday designate a special day once a month at the end of the month starting w/ Halloween. Allowing kids to be dressed up for school, teachers can do special activities. More information will be sent out by the end of this week.

Last day before Dec Break - comfy-cozy day
On Monday January 4 - TRE turns 50!! 70's day

Remote learners are encouraged to participate in this as well. Gina reminded everyone to take pictures for the yearbook!
